Who is Qualified? Individuals eligible for hospice care include those with approval from their doctor, those diagnosed with a terminal illness, or those who have chosen palliative care instead of curative treatment.

Who is Hospice Care For? Hospice care is available to anyone with a limited life expectancy and a terminal illness, including but not limited to Alzheimer's disease, heart and lung disease, stroke, cancer, COPD, and CHF.

When is the Right Time for Hospice Care? Patients qualify for hospice when curative treatments are no longer effective. It is never too late to seek hospice care.

Will a New Physician Be Required? No. Most hospice patients continue receiving care from their primary doctor. TRM Hospice coordinates directly with the patient's physician to ensure seamless care.

Where is Hospice Provided? TRM Hospice provides care wherever a patient needs it. Our preference is to offer care in the comfort of a patient's home, but if that is not possible, we work to create a home-like environment in any setting.

How is Hospice Paid For? Hospice care is covered by Medicare, Medicaid, private insurance, or private pay. However, no patient is denied care due to an inability to pay.

When a caregiver or family member needs a break, the patient can stay in an inpatient care setting for up to five days.

In a medical crisis, our staff can provide around-the-clock in-home care. When the crisis is over, the patient transitions to Routine Care.
